The Russell 3000® Growth Index measures the growth segment of the U.S. equity universe. It includes those Russell 3000® Index companies with higher growth earning potential, as defined by Russell's leading style methodology. The index is unmanaged and one cannot invest directly in it. Price-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is determined by dividing the price of the stock by the company's forecasted earnings per share. EPS Growth Rate represents the annualized rate of net-income-per-share growth over the trailing five-year period for the stocks held by a fund. Market Capitalization is the value of the fund as determined by the market price of its issued and outstanding stock. The Weighted Average Market Capitalization of a portfolio equals the average of each holding's market cap, weighted by its relative position size in the portfolio (in such a weighting scheme, larger positions have a greater influence on the calculation). Active Share is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a manager(s) portfolio that differ from the benchmark index. Price to Book Ratio is a ratio used to compare a stock's market value to its book value. It is calculated by dividing the current closing price of the stock by the latest quarter's book value per share. Return On Equity - ROE: The amount of net income returned as a percentage of shareholders equity. Return on equity measures a corporation's profitability by revealing how much profit a company generates with the money shareholders have invested. ROE is expressed as a percentage and calculated as: Return on Equity = Net Income/Shareholder's Equity.
