

Definitions: R-Squared is a measure that represents the percentage of a portfolio's movements that can be explained by movements in a benchmark. Alpha measures the difference between a fund's actual returns and its expected performance, given its level of risk as measured by beta. Beta measures volatility in relation to the fund's benchmark. Standard Deviation measures the degree to which a fund's performance has varied from its average performance over a particular time period. The greater the standard deviation, the greater a fund's volatility.

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The Morningstar RatingTM for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each tegory receive 5 stars. The next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 45% receive 4 stars, the next 45%
