

1. Royce classifies a client account as 'Core' because it anticipates the client account equity holdings will have a weighted average price-to-book ratio or weighted average normalized price-to-earnings ratio that is similar to, or somewhat higher than, its general asset class. 2. Geometric Average. This weighted calculation uses each portfolio holding's market cap in a way designed to not skew the effect of very large or small holdings; instead, it aims to better identify the portfolio's center, which Royce believes offers a more accurate measure of average market cap than a simple mean or median. 3. Below Average Volatility. The Fund was in the second-lowest volatility quintile compared with all funds in Morningstar's Small Growth, Small Blend, and Small Value Categories with at least five years of history, a total of 489 funds as of 9/30/21. The universe consists of each fund's oldest share dass only. Volatility quintiles are based on the average five-year standard deviation for each of the last four calendar quarters. Higher volatility is usually associated with higher risk. 4. Active Share is the sum of the absolute values of the different weightings of each holding in the Portfolio versus each holding in the benchmark, divided by two. 5. Mr. Royce has been the Fund's manager since 1972. 6. Harmonic Average. This weighted calculation evaluates a portfolio as if it were a single stock and measures it overall. It compares the total market value of the portfolio's share in the earnings or book value, as the case may be, of its underlying stocks. 7. The Portfolio's P/E Ratio calculation uses trailing 12-month earnings and excludes companies with zero or negative earnings (14% of portfolio holdings as of 9/30/21).



Long-Term Risk/Return Profile


Russell 2000 Inception (12/31/78) to 9/30/21 (%)
