September 30, 2021

A diversified multi-managed fund that provides exposure to large cap stocks of US companies believed to be undervalued in the market.

Diversification. The multi-manager approach allows for a blending of diverse investment styles, seeking to provide for a “smoother ride,” as the different styles of each manager are expected to be rewarded at different stages of the market cycle.

Tactical manager allocation. Active allocation among underlying subadvisors based on forward-looking investment views.

Enhanced risk and return. The fund has the ability to implement 130/30 equity strategies in an attempt to enhance the risk-and-return profile via manager insights on the short side.

Special considerations:

Investors in the Fund should be able to withstand short-term fluctuations in the equity markets in return for potentially higher returns over the long term. The value of the Fund changes every day and may be affected by changes in interest rates, general market conditions, and other political, social and economic developments, as well as specific matters relating to the companies in whose securities the Fund invests. The value of the Fund's investments in foreign securities may fall due to adverse political, social and economic developments abroad, and due to decreases in foreign currency values relative to the US dollar. Risk information:

Short sales risk: There are certain unique risks associated with the use of short sales strategies. When selling a security short, the investment advisor will sell a security it does not own at the then-current market price and then borrow the security to deliver to the buyer. The Fund is then obligated to buy the security on a later date so it can return the security to the lender. Short sales, therefore, involve the risk that the Fund will incur a loss by subsequently buying a security at a higher price than the price at which the Fund previously sold the security short. This would occur if the securities lender required the Fund to deliver the securities the Fund had borrowed at the commencement of the short sale and the Fund was unable to either purchase the security at a favorable price or to borrow the security from another securities lender. If this occurs at a time when other short sellers of the security also want to close out their positions, a "short squeeze" can occur. A short squeeze occurs when demand is greater than supply for the security sold short. Moreover, because a fund's loss on a short sale arises from increases in the value of the security sold short, such loss, like the price of the security sold short, is theoretically unlimited. By contrast, a fund's loss on a long position arises from decreases in the value of the security and therefore is limited by the fact that a security's value cannot drop below zero. It is possible that the Fund's securities held long will decline in value at the same time that the value of the securities sold short increases, thereby increasing the potential for loss.

¹ As of September 30, 2021, the Fund was rated 2 stars, out of 1144 funds, for the 3-year period; 2 stars, out of 1022 funds, for the 5-year period; and 2 stars, out of 747 funds, for the 10-year period. The Fund load-waived was rated 2 stars for the 3-year period, 2 stars for the 5-year period and 2 stars for the 10-year period out of 1144, 1022 and 747 funds, respectively. Morningstar percentile rankings and star ratings shown are for Class P shares only. Percentile rankings and star ratings for other share classes may vary. Morningstar percentile rankings do not account for a fund's sales charge. Morningstar star ratings do include the effects of sales charges and loads, while the load-waived ratings do not. Ten percent of funds in an investment category receive a five-star rating, 22.5% receive a four-star rating, 35% receive a three-star rating, 22.5% receive a two-star rating, and 10% receive a one-star rating. The Fund and UBS AM have entered into a written fee waiver/expense reimbursement agreement pursuant to which UBS AM is contractually obligated to: 1) waive its management fees through November 30, 2021 to the extent necessary to offset the cost savings to UBS AM for allocating a portion of the Fund's assets to other unaffiliated pooled investment vehicles and index futures; and 2) waive a portion of its management fees and/or reimburse expenses through November 30, 2021 so that the Fund's ordinary total operating expenses (excluding dividend expense, borrowing costs and interest expense relating to short sales, and expenses attributable to investment in other investment companies, interest, taxes, brokerage commissions and extraordinary expenses) would not exceed 1.14% for Class A, 0.89 for Class Y and 0.89% for Class P.
