# Fund strategy

The Fund invests, under normal market conditions, primarily in equity securities of companies headquartered outside the U.S., including those in emerging market countries. The Fund Managers utilize a core investment style with a modest growth tilt and may invest in companies across the market capitalization range in order to achieve the Fund's objective. The Fund Managers seek to make investments in non-US listed companies based on a multidimensional investment process that considers growth, valuation, price-trend, and beta.

# Fund manager's commentary

- We underperformed a falling index in US dollar terms over the third quarter.
- This was entirely down to the fall in equities over the last two weeks of the quarter as market trends reversed.
- We are buyers of September's dip, moving to 75% bullish and 25% bearish.

We underperformed a falling index in US dollar terms over the third quarter. This was entirely down to the fall in equities over the last two weeks of the quarter as market trends reversed. Up until then we had been outperforming the index, but we ended the quarter behind the benchmark due to negative stock selection.

The bottom five stocks by relative performance (Peptidream, Fortescue, BionTech, Siemens Gamesa and SK Hynix) more than offset our top five performers (Z Holdings, Icon, Recruit, STMicro, and Orix).

Many investors seem dogmatically stuck on the 'Value' versus 'Growth' debate when the truth is pragmatically somewhere in the middle, depending on the business cycle. This is why we combine Growth, Value and Momentum factors over the cycle. Value usually performs best during the first year of an economic recovery, when earnings growth rates are accelerating. Growth usually performs better after that, as earnings growth rates start to decelerate; which is what started to happen this quarter, until the reversal in the last two weeks of the quarter.

Year to date, Value and Growth performance has been roughly equal, while the Momentum factor significantly underperformed as it was whipsawed by several rotations between Value and Growth.

Slower global economic and earnings growth lies ahead and markets are beginning to worry about stagflation (slowing growth with rising inflation). A moderation in growth will probably allow supply chains to catch up and inflation to fall, which is already happening in some commodity markets. China was the first major economy into and then out of COVID and then the

first to slow down again - it will probably be followed by the US and Europe, which should ease inflationary concerns.

Cyclicals are called cyclical for a reason, as most of their relative outperformance usually occurs within 6-18 months of the recovery from a recession when they have the best relative earnings growth. Stable growth then usually outperforms during the mid to late cycle as by this point they have the best relative earnings growth. We do not see any reason for this historical pattern to change – albeit there may be significant volatility.

We are buyers of September's dip, moving to 75% bullish and 25% bearish. The highest probability outcome is still "one of the biggest ever equity bull markets, followed by one of the biggest ever equity bear markets" but some early warning signs are flashing, so we will keep an open mind in a fast changing world. Our scenario analysis and portfolios are adjusting to:

- Scenario 1: 40% (was 35%) -Equity markets rally with the old leadership, i.e. stable growth & high quality stocks as growth slows.
- Scenario 2: still 35% -Equity markets rally with new leadership, i.e. cyclicals & financials if growth is better than expected
- Scenario 3: 25% (was 30%) -Equity markets fall if growth slows faster than we expect or if fiscal/monetary policy is tightened to fast.
- If policy makers recognise and react to slowing growth, we probably move to 80% bullish, 20% bearish (45/35/20), if not we might get more bearish.

Correlation to benchmark is a measure of the strength of the relationship between a fund and its index.

Sharpe ratio is a risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk.

Alpha is a measurement of a fund's risk-adjusted performance against its index.

Standard deviation is a statistical measure of distribution around an average, which depicts how widely returns varied over a certain period of time. When a fund has a high standard deviation, the predicted range of performance is wide, implying greater volatility.

Tracking error is a measure of how closely a Fund's performance follows its index.

Upside and downside capture measures a manager's ability to generate excess return above the benchmark return in up markets and retain more of the excess return in down markets. The upside/downside capture ratio is the Fund's up/down market return divided by the index's up/down market return and equals the linked returns for all quarters in which the index return was greater/less than zero.

You can buy or sell shares of the Fund on any business day that the Fund is open through your broker or financial intermediary, or by mail or telephone. You can pay for shares by wire.
