Investment Strategy

The investment seeks to provide capital appreciation. The fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing, under normal circumstances, at least 80% of its net assets in the equity securities of midcapitalization companies. Mid-capitalization companies are defined for this purpose as companies with market capitalizations at the time of purchase between the lesser of \$2 billion or the market capitalization of the smallest company included in the Russell Midcap® Index, and the greater of \$20 billion or the market capitalization of the largest company included in the Russell Midcap® Index.

The Fund's advisor has contractually agreed to waive its fees and/or pay for operating expenses of the Fund to ensure that total annual fund operating expenses (excluding any acquired fund fees and expenses, taxes, interest, brokerage fees, certain insurance costs, and extraordinary and other non-routine expenses) do not exceed 1.06% for Institutional Class shares. This agreement is in effect until April 1, 2023. The Fund's advisor is permitted to seek reimbursement from the Fund of fees waived for a period of three years from the date of the waiver or payment to the extent it does not exceed expense limits. Performance would have been lower without fee waivers in effect.

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

Description of Terms and Index: Enterprise Value: Firm's total value, calculated as total market capitalization plus total debt minus cash. Return on Equity: Percentage a company earns on its equity, calculated by dividing net income by shareholders' equity. Return on Invested Income: Firm efficiency at allocating capital to profitable investments, calculated as net income minus dividend, divided by invested capital (debt plus equity). Price/Earnings Ratio: Indicator of stock valuation, calculated by dividing shareholders' equity by net income. Price/Book Ratio: Indicator of stock valuation, calculated by dividing shareholders' equity by book value. Price/Free Cash Flow Ratio: Indicator of stock valuation, calculated by dividing shareholders' equity by free cash flow. The Russell 2500 Index is composed of the bottom 500 stocks in the Russell 1000 Index and all the stocks in the Russell 2000 Index. The Russell 2500 Growth Index is composed of the bottom 500 stocks in the Russell 1000 Index and all the stocks in the Russell 2000 Index and measures companies with higher price/book ratios and higher forecasted growth values. The Russell 2500 Value Index is composed of the bottom 500 stocks in the Russell 2500 Value Index is composed of the bottom 500 stocks in the Russell 2500 Index and all the stocks in the Russell 2000 Index and measures companies with lower price/book ratios and lower forecasted growth values. Standard deviation is a measure of the dispersion of a set of data from its mean. Sharpe ratio is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk. Upside capture ratio measures a fund's performance in up markets relative to its benchmark, calculated by dividing the fund's upside return by the benchmark's upside return. Downside capture ratio measures a fund's performance in down markets relative to its benchmark, calculated by dividing the fund's downside return by the benchmark's downside return.
