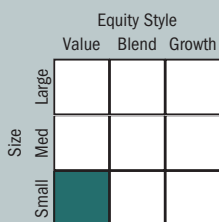

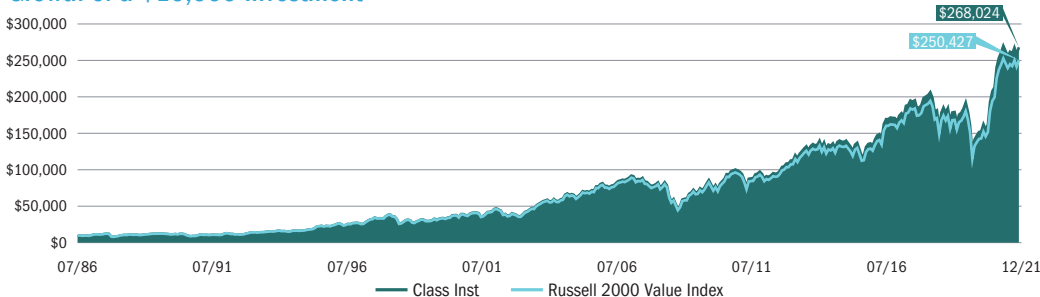

Investment risks — **Market** risk may affect a single issuer, sector of the economy, industry or the market as a whole. **Foreign** investments subject the fund to risks, including political, economic, market, social and others within a particular country, as well as to currency instabilities and less stringent financial and accounting standards generally applicable to U.S. issuers. Investments in **small-cap** companies may be subject to greater volatility and price fluctuations because they may be thinly traded and less liquid. **Value** securities may be unprofitable if the market fails to recognize their intrinsic worth or the portfolio manager misgauged that worth. The fund may invest significantly in issuers within a particular **sector**, which may be negatively affected by market, economic or other conditions, making the fund more vulnerable to unfavorable developments in the sector.

[▲] **Beta** measures a fund's risk relative to its benchmark. A beta of 1.00 indicates that the fund is as volatile as its benchmark. **R-squared** ranges from 0.00 to 1.00 and tells what percentage of an investment's movements is explained by movements in its benchmark index. **Sharpe ratio** divides a fund's gross return (excluding fees and expenses) in excess of the 90-day Treasury bill by the investment's standard deviation to measure risk-adjusted performance. **Standard deviation** is a statistical measure of the degree to which an individual value in a probability distribution tends to vary from the mean of the distribution. **Price-to-book ratio** is a stock's price divided by its book value, and may help determine if it is valued fairly. **Price-to-earnings ratio** is a stock's price divided by after-tax earnings over a trailing 12-month period, which serves as an indicator of value based on earnings. **Active Share** is a measure of the percentage of equity holdings in a portfolio that differ from the benchmark index as of month end. Active Share can be calculated as 100% minus the sum of the overlapping holdings of the portfolio and the index. A portfolio that is identical to the benchmark index will have an active share of 0%, while 100% indicates no overlap in holdings.

Fund holdings are as of the date given, subject to change at any time, and not recommendations to buy or sell any security. Top holdings include cash but exclude short-term holdings, if applicable.

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Morningstar Percentile Rankings are based on the average annual total returns of the funds in the category for the periods stated. They do not include sales charges or redemption fees but do include operating expenses and the reinvestment of dividends and capital gains distributions. Share class rankings vary due to different expenses. If sales charges or redemption fees were included, total returns would be lower. For each fund with at least a three-year history, Morningstar calculates a Morningstar Rating[™] used to rank the fund against other funds in the same category. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly excess performance, without any adjustments for loads (front-end, deferred, or redemption fees), placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. The top 10% of funds in each category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. (Each share class is counted as a fraction of one fund within this scale and rated separately, which may cause slight variations in the distribution percentages.) **The Morningstar ratings for the overall-, three-, five- and ten-year periods for the A-share are 3 stars, 3 stars, 3 stars, and 3 stars and for the Inst-share are 3 stars, 3 stars, 3 stars, and 3 stars among 418, 418, 392 and 300 Small Value funds, respectively, and are based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure.** The Overall Morningstar Rating for a fund is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five- and ten-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics.

The **Russell 2000 Value Index** is an unmanaged index that tracks the performance of those Russell 2000 Index companies with lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values. It is not possible to invest directly in an index.
