The upside capture ratio is an indication of a manager's ability to match returns in periods of merket strength, while the downside capture ratio measures a manager's ability to curtail losses in periods of inception through the stated date. Upside/downside ratios are calculated using FactSet.

For each fund with at least a three-year history, Morningstar calculates a Morningstar Rating<sup>™</sup> based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly performance (including the effects of sales charges, loads, and redemption fees), placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of funds in each category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. (Each share class is counted as a fraction of one fund within this scale and rated separately, which may cause slight variations in the distribution percentages.) The Overall Morningstar Rating<sup>™</sup> for a fund is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-,five- and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating/20% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10- year gainst the following number of U.S.-domiciled Mid-Cap Value funds over the following time periods: 391 in the last three years. With respect to these Mid-Cap Value funds, Nuance Mid Cap Value Z Share received a Morningstar Rating of 4 stars for 3-year rating. Morningstar Rating is for the share class only; other classes may have different performance characteristics.
