The Fund seeks investment results that correspond generally (before fees and expenses) to the total return of the Russell RAFI™ US Large Company Index.

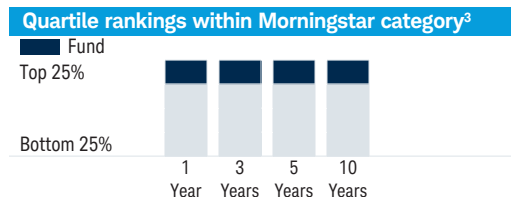

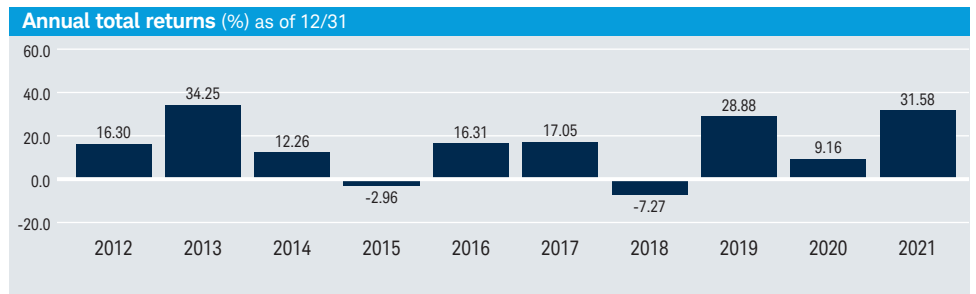

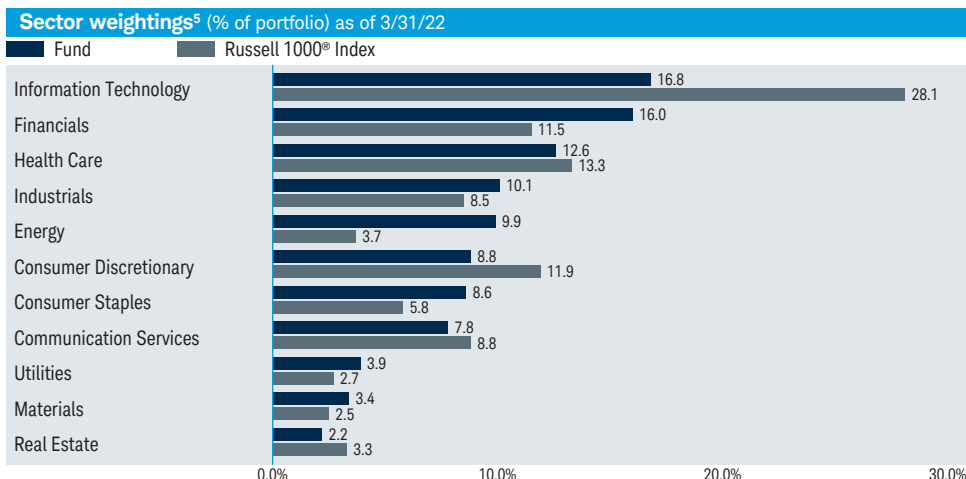

(Each share class is counted as a fraction of 1 fund within this scale and rated separately, which may cause slight variations in the distribution percentages). **Fundamental U.S. Large Company Spliced Index** An internally calculated index comprised of the FTSE RAFI US 1000 Index from inception of the Schwab Fundamental US Large Company Index Fund until the close of business on 10/18/12 and the Russell RAFI™ US Large Company Index from 10/19/12 forward, when the Fund began tracking the index. FTSE RAFI US 1000 Index is designed to track the performance of the largest U.S. equities, selected based on the following four fundamental measures of firm size, book value, income, sales and dividends. The 1,000 equities with the highest fundamental strength are weighted by their fundamental scale. The fundamentally weighted portfolio is rebalanced and reconstituted annually.

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
