## >> Fund Objective

This actively managed exchange-traded fund seeks to provide current income, with a secondary investment objective of capital appreciation.

#### >> Fund Description

- The First Trust BuyWrite Income ETF seeks to pursue its investment objectives by combining a stock portfolio with an index option strategy.
  - The fund will invest primarily in U.S. equity securities of all market capitalizations, favoring high dividend-paying common stocks.
- The fund will also utilize an options strategy in which it will write (sell) U.S. exchange-traded covered call options on the S&P 500 Index seeking to generate additional cash flow in the form of premiums on the options that may be distributed to shareholders on a monthly basis. A premium is the income received by an investor who sells the option contract to another party.
- >> Through the investment process, the advisor seeks to maximize returns through a portfolio that is tactical and transparent.
  - The Advisor selects the equity portion from a universe of U.S. exchange-listed common stocks of all market capitalizations, American Depositary Receipts and Global Depositary Receipts.
  - The Advisor will then apply a mathematical optimization process which uses market capitalization, liquidity, operating cash
    flow, dividend yield, share repurchases, and debt issuance factor constraints to produce a diversified portfolio favoring higher
    dividend-paying stocks that will seek to have an approximate tracking error of 300 500 basis points (3-5%) relative to the
    S&P 500 Index.
  - The Advisor will apply a covered call strategy to potentially generate additional income and provide a degree of protection against short-term volatility.
  - The equity portfolio will be rebalanced periodically at the discretion of the investment team. The option portfolio will be actively managed reflecting the underlying portfolio and market conditions and opportunities.

Unlike mutual funds, shares of the fund may only be redeemed directly from a fund by authorized participants in very large creation/redemption units. If a fund's authorized participants are unable to proceed with creation/redemption orders and no other authorized participant is able to step forward to create or redeem, fund shares may trade at a premium or discount to a fund's net asset value and possibly face delisting and the bid/ask spread may widen.

A fund may be subject to the risk that a counterparty will not fulfill its obligations which may result in significant financial loss to a fund.

The writer of a covered call option foregoes any profit from increases in the market value of the underlying security covering the call option above the sum of the premium and the strike price of the call, but retains the risk of loss if the underlying security declines in value. Additionally, there is no guarantee that vaccines will be effective against emerging variants of the disease.

A fund faces numerous market trading risks, including the potential lack of an active market for fund shares due to a limited number of market makers. Decisions by market makers or authorized participants to reduce their role or step away in times of market stress could inhibit the effectiveness of the arbitrage proces in maintaining the relationship between the underlying values of a fund's portfolio securities and a fund's market price.

Securities of non-U.S. issuers are subject to additional risks, including currency fluctuations, political risks, withholding, lack of liquidity, lack of adequate financial information, and exchange control restrictions impacting non-U.S. issuers.

#### **Definitions**

Standard Deviation is a measure of price variability (risk). Alpha is an indication of how much an investment outperforms or underperforms on a risk-adjusted basis relative to its benchmark. Beta is a measure of price variability relative to the market. Sharpe Ratio is a measure of excess reward per unit of volatility. Correlation is a measure of the similarity of performance. The CBO S&P 500 BuyWrite Index is a benchmark index designed to track the performance of a hypothetical buy-write strategy on the S&P 500 Index. It is a passive total return index based on buying an S&P 500 stock index portfolio, and writing (or selling) the near-term S&P 500 Index covered call option. The S&P 500 Index is an unmanaged index of 500 companies used to measure large-cap U.S. stock market performance.
