This exchange-traded fund seeks investment results that correspond generally to the price and yield (before the fund's fees and expenses) of an equity index called The Capital Strength Index<sup>SM</sup>.

### >> Index Description

- >> A security must be a common stock or REIT that is a member of the Nasdaq US Benchmark Index<sup>TM</sup>. The largest 500 securities by float-adjusted market capitalization with a minimum three-month average daily dollar trading volume of \$5 million are selected. Multiple share classes of the same issuer are excluded.
- >> To be eligible for inclusion in the index, companies must have:
  - at least \$1 billion in cash or short-term investments.
  - a long-term debt to market cap ratio less than 30%.
  - a return on equity greater than 15%.
- >> Eligible securities are then ranked by a combined short-term (90 days) and long-term (260 days) realized volatility.
- >> The 50 securities with the lowest combined volatility score are selected for inclusion in the index.
- >> A maximum weight of 30% in any one Industry Classification Benchmark industry is allowed. If an industry has a weight greater than 30%, the highest ranking security by volatility will be removed and replaced with the next eligible security from a different industry. This process is repeated until no industry has a weight greater than 30%.
- >> The index stocks are equally weighted initially and on each rebalancing effective date. The index is reconstituted and rebalanced on a quarterly basis.

§The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance.
