- >> The Nasdaq Riskalyze US Small Cap Index™ is a modified market capitalization weighted index which seeks to provide a diversified portfolio of dividend-paying US small cap securities.
- >> To be eligible for inclusion in the index, a security must meet certain criteria, including:
 - being a member of the Nasdaq US 700 Small Cap Index,
 - having paid a dividend in the trailing twelve months.
- >> Sector weights are assigned that are equal to the sector weights within the Nasdaq US 700 Small Cap Index.
- >> Securities within each sector are equally weighted.
- >> The index is rebalanced and reconstituted on a quarterly basis.

Definitions
