Potentially investing in lower-quality debt securities and engaging in transactions that have a leveraging effect on the fund, including derivatives.

Market returns are based on the closing price on the listed exchange at 4 p.m. ET and do not represent the returns an investor would receive if shares were traded at other times.

In general the bond market, especially foreign markets, is volatile, and can decline significantly in response to adverse issuer, political, regulatory, market, or economic developments. Fixed income securities carry interest rate risk. (As interest rates rise, bond prices usually fall, and vice versa. This effect is usually more pronounced for longer-term securities.) 30-Day SEC Yield is based on yield to maturity of a fund's investments and not on the dividends paid by the fund, which may differ. **Bloomberg U.S. Credit Bond Index** is a market value-weighted index of investment-grade corporate fixed-rate debt issues with maturities of one year or more. **Duration** is a measure of a security's price sensitivity to changes in interest rates. Duration differs from maturity in that it considers a security's interest payments in addition to the amount of time until the security reaches maturity, and also takes into account certain maturity-shortening features (e.g., demand features, interest rate resets, and call options) when applicable. Securities with longer effective durations generally tend to be more sensitive to interest rate changes than securities with shorter effective durations. A fund with a longer average effective duration generally can be expected to be more sensitive to interest rate changes than a fund with a shorter average effective duration. **Expense Ratio** is the fund's total annual fund operating expenses as available in each fund's prospectus and represents the expenses that you pay each year as a percentage of the value of your investment. Any applicable brokerage charges are not included in the expense ratio. **Morningstar Averages** represent the average return of all funds within their respective fund investment category.
