### **Investment Objective**


The Fund aims to generate long-term capital growth through investing principally in securities of companies having their head office or exercising a predominant part of their activity in less developed countries of Asia that are considered as emerging markets. The Fund may invest its net assets directly in China A and B Shares. A minimum of 50% of the Fund's net assets will be invested in securities deemed to maintain sustainable characteristics. The Fund is actively managed. The Investment Manager will, when selecting investments for the Fund and for the purposes of monitoring risk, reference MSCI Emerging Markets Asia Index (the "Index") as the Index constituents are representative of the type of companies the Fund invests in. The Fund's performance can be assessed against its Index. The Investment Manager has a wide range of discretion relative to the Index. While the Fund will hold assets that are components of the Index, it may also invest in companies, countries or sectors that are not included in, and that have different weightings from, the Index in order to take advantage of investment opportunities. It is expected that over long time periods, the Fund's performance will differ from the Index. However, over short time periods, the Fund's performance may be close to the Index, depending on market conditions. Shareholders' attention is drawn to the fact that the Index is not an index which integrates environmental and social considerations. Instead, the Fund promotes environmental and social characteristics by adhering to the Fidelity Sustainable Investing Framework, as described above.



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#### **Definition of Terms**

Annualised Volatility is a measure of how variable returns for a fund or comparative market index have been around their historical average. Two funds may produce the same return over a period. The fund whose monthly returns have varied less will have a lower annualised volatility and will be considered to have achieved its returns with less risk.

Beta is a measure of a fund's sensitivity to market movement (as represented by a market index). The beta of the market is 1.00 by definition. A beta of 1.10 shows that the fund could be expected to perform 10% better than the index in up markets and 10% worse in down markets, assuming all other factors remain constant. Conversely, a beta of 0.85 indicates that the fund could be expected to perform 15% worse than the market return during up markets and 15% better during down markets.

Sharpe Ratio is a measure of a fund's risk adjusted performance taking into account the return on a risk-free investment. The ratio allows an investor to assess whether the fund is generating adequate returns for the level of risk it is taking. The higher the ratio, the better the risk-adjusted performance has been. If the ratio is negative, the fund has returned less than the risk-free rate.

Active Money is the sum of the fund's overweight positions (including effective cash) when compared to the market index.

A position combines all equity investments (including derivatives) linked to an issuing company. Derivatives are included on an exposure basis so they reflect the equivalent underlying shares needed to generate the same return. Geographic and sector breakdown tables are calculated using the positions methodology.

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
#### **ESG Metrics**

ESG refers to 'environmental, social and governance' criteria which are three central factors used in measuring the sustainability of an investment in securities of an issuer. By way of example, "environmental" may cover themes such as climate risks and natural resources scarcity, "social" may include labour issues and product liability risks such as data security and "governance" may encompass items such as business ethics and executive pay.

The factsheet is a snapshot of the portfolio at the date indicated above. ESG ratings distribution may vary over time. Representation of this data is for informational purposes only. Please refer to the offering documents for details, including the investment objectives of the fund and risk factors associated with sustainable investing.

#### Glossarv

MSCI ESG Fund Rating: This shows the funds ESG rating based on the Quality Scores given to the fund by MSCI. This ranges from AAA, AA (Leader), A, BBB, BB (Average) to B, CCC (Laggard). Weighted Average Carbon Intensity: Provides a snapshot of the fund's exposure to carbon-intensive companies. Greenhouse gas emissions are based on portfolio weights, rather than ownership share, to allow for comparison across multiple asset classes. The smaller the value shows, the lower the greenhouse gas emissions.

Carbon Footprint: Provides a normalized snapshot of the funds contribution to carbon emissions. The smaller the value shows, the lower the carbon emissions.

**SFDR Classification:** Shows the classification given to each fund as part of the EU Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR). Article 9 funds aim to achieve an ESG outcome and are products with ESG objectives. Article 8 funds focus on promoting ESG characteristics and this must be a primary focus of the product. Article 6 funds integrate sustainability risks into investment analysis and decision-making, without the funds promoting environmental or social characteristics or having sustainable investments as their objective.

MSCI ESG Ratings Distribution: This shows the percentage distribution of ESG ratings in the fund, based on the Net Asset Value of holdings excluding cash, liquidity funds, derivatives and Exchange Traded Funds.
