Alpha: Alpha is a measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis. Alpha takes the volability (price risk) of a security or mutual fund and compares its risk-adjusted performance to a benchmark index. The excess return of the security or fund relative to the return of the benchmark index is a fund's alpha. Beta: Beta measures the relationship between the portfolio's excess return over T-bills (representing a risk-free rate) relative to the excess return of the portfolio's benchmark. A low beta does not imply that the portfolio has a low level of volatility; rather, a low beta means that the portfolio's market-related risk is low. Beta is often referred to as systematic risk. Downside Capture Ratio: The downside capture Ratio is one in which the market's quarterly (or monthly) return is less than zero. For example, a ratio of 50% means that the portfolio's value fell half as much as its benchmark index during down markets. Earnings Per Share (EPS): is a company's profits per share of common stock. Information Ratio: The information ratio (IR) measures a portfolio manager. The higher the IR, the more consistent a manager is a fact that the portfolio's historical risk-adjusted performance of the most recent quarter. Price/earnings Ratio (P/E): Price/earnings (or P/E): Price/earn will be zero. **Upside Capture Ratio**: The upside capture ratio is a measure of a manager's performance in up markets relative to a particular benchmark. An up market is one in which the market's quarterly (or monthly) return is greater than or equal to zero. For example, a ratio of 50% means that the portfolio's value increased half as much as its benchmark index during up markets.
