Fund description

The Invesco DWA SmallCap Momentum ETF (Fund) is based on the Dorsey Wright® SmallCap Technical Leaders Index (Index). The Fund will normally invest at least 90% of its total assets in equity securities of small capitalization companies that comprise the Index. The Index includes securities pursuant to a Dorsey, Wright Associates, LLC proprietary selection methodology that is designed to identify companies that demonstrate powerful relative strength characteristics based on that company's market performance. Approximately 200 companies are selected for inclusion in the Index from the Nasdaq US Benchmark Index. The Fund and the Index are rebalanced and reconstituted quarterly.





Glossary

30 Day SEC Unsubsidized Yield reflects the 30-day yield if the investment adviser were not waiving all or part of its fee or reimbursing the fund for part of its expenses. Total return would have also been lower in the absence of these temporary reimbursements or waivers.

30 Day SEC Yield is based on a 30-day period and is computed by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the period.

Intraday NAV is a symbol representing estimated fair value based on the most recent intraday price of underlying assets.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio (P/B Ratio) is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is the share price divided by earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.

Weighted Average Return on Equity is net income divided by net worth.

Weighted Market Capitalization is the sum of each underlying securities market value.
