Fund description

The Invesco KBW Property Casualty Insurance ETF (Fund) is based on the KBW Nasdag Property & Casualty Index (Index). The Fund will normally invest at least 90% of its total assets in securities that comprise the Index. The Index is a modified market capitalization weighted index of companies primarily engaged in US property and casualty insurance activities Keefe, Bruyette Woods, Inc. and Nasdaq, Inc. compile, maintain and calculate the Index. The Fund and the Index are rebalanced and reconstituted guarterly.





Glossary

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30 Day SEC Unsubsidized Yield reflects the 30-day yield if the investment adviser were not waiving all or part of its fee or reimbursing the fund for part of its expenses. 30 Day SEC Yield is based on a 30-day period and is computed by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the period.

Intraday NAV is a symbol representing estimated fair value based on the most recent intraday price of underlying assets.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio (P/B Ratio) is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is the share price divided by earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.

Weighted Average Return on Equity is net income divided by net worth.

Weighted Market Capitalization is the sum of each underlying securities market value.
