- The index is weighted based on trailing 12-month dividend yield. For potential diversification, no single country or GICS sector can be greater than 25%, and no stock weight can be greater than 3% in the Index

About This Benchmark

The S&P Emerging Markets Dividend Opportunities Index is comprised of 100 of the highest yielding emerging markets stocks that meet certain investability requirements. Stocks must have stable or increasing three-year dividend growth and stocks must be profitable, as measured by positive earnings per share before extraordinary items, over the latest 12-month period as of the rebalancing reference date. The Index is weighted based on trailing twelve-month dividend yield, subject to specific diversification requirements.

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Glossary

NAV The market value of a mutual fund's or ETFs total assets, minus liabilities, divided by the number of shares outstanding.

Market Value Determined by the midpoint between the bid/offer prices as of the closing time of the New York Stock Exchange (typically 4:00PM EST) on business days.

Gross Expense Ratio The fund's total annual operating expense ratio. It is gross of any fee waivers or expense reimbursements. It can be found in the fund's most recent prospectus.

30 Day SEC Yield (Also known as Standardized Yield) An annualized yield that is calculated by dividing the net investment income earned by the fund over the most recent 30-day period by the current maximum offering price.

Index Dividend Yield The weighted average of the underlyings' indicated annual dividend divided by price, expressed as a percentage. Price/Earnings Ratio FY1 The weighted harmonic average of current share price divided by the forecasted one year earnings per share for each security in the fund. Negative and positive outliers are included in the calculation

Price/Book Ratio The weighted harmonic average of closing market price divided by the most recent reported book value for each security in the fund's portfolio as calculated for the last twelve months.
