The Fund mitigates some Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) risks by applying 'sin' sector exclusions, and then seeks to identify ESG opportunities by focusing on companies which our research suggests are a net benefit to society, which balance the interests of all stakeholders, and which exhibit a responsible culture. Global Stewardship portfolios are managed by a team which benefits from experienced investors and ESG specialists.

The net expense ratios for this fund are contractually capped (excluding taxes, sub-accounting expenses and extraordinary expenses) through April 30, 2023. *Not annualized.

Definitions

Active Share – A measure of the Fund's overlap with the benchmark. An active share of 100 indicates no overlap with the benchmark and an active share of zero indicates a portfolio that tracks the benchmark.

Annual Turnover – Turnover is calculated as the smaller figure of either purchases or sales for the month and dividing it by an average fund market value. Annual Turnover is calculated as the sum of the monthly turnover figures for the 12 month period.


Market Cap – The weighted average size of companies represented in the portfolio, denoted by market capitalization.

Price/Book – The weighted average ratio of current share price to last reported company book value per share. This represents a measure of valuation levels Price/Sales – The weighted average ratio of current share price divided by the 12 month forward sales per share. This represents a measure of valuation levels. Earnings Growth – The weighted average growth in earnings per share of current portfolio holdings delivered over the past 5 years, expressed in % per annum. This represents a measure of delivered profits growth for the current

Return on Equity – The weighted average ratio of 12 month forward earnings per share divided by the last reported book value per share. This represents a forward-looking measure of profitability, based on the current holdings of the portfolio or benchmark.

Beta – Beta is a measure of systematic risk, denoting the sensitivity of a fund to the direction of the market. Measures of beta that are significantly higher (lower) than 1.0 indicate a greater (lesser) degree of sensitivity to market direction. Standard Deviation – A measure of the volatility of absolute returns. It is a measure of the dispersion of a set of absolute returns from its mean.

The Fund may not choose to invest in potentially profitable companies or could sell investments based on ESG factors when it might be a financial disadvantage to do so.
