Allocation by Region^{7,8}



The average annual returns for Class C Shares reflect a CDSC (contingent deferred sales charge) of 1.00% in the year-to-date and first year only. Class I Shares require \$1MM minimum investment and are offered without sales charge. Class R6 Shares are offered without sales charge. Operating expenses reflect the Fund's total annual operating expenses for the share class as of the Fund's most current prospectus, including management fees and other expenses.

- 2. Alpha is a measure of the active return on an investment, the performance of that investment compared with a suitable market index.

 3. Beta is a measure of the fund's volatility (risk) relative to the overall market. The higher the fund's Beta, the more the fund price is expected to change in response to a given change in the value of the market.
- 4. Standard deviation is a statistical measure of how returns over time have varied from the mean. A lower number signifies lower volatility.
- 5. Active share measures the percentage of a fund's portfolio holdings differing from its benchmark. Active share can range from 0% (index fund) to 100% (no commonality
