The Institutional Class was rated, based on its risk-adjusted returns, 4 stars for the Overall, 4 stars for the 3-year, 4 stars for the 5-year, and 4 stars for the 10-year periods among 153, 153, 148, and 89 Global Large-Stock Value funds, respectively. The Morningstar Rating for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products with at least a three-year history and does not include the effect of sales charges. Exchange-traded funds and open-end mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics.

Fund Highlights and Applications

- **Diversification**² - Optimized across developed markets, the fund seeks to provide a well-diversified equity portfolio. Additionally, the fund opportunistically hedges currency exposure, which may potentially limit volatility and improve total returns.
- **Yield** - The fund emphasizes yield by investing in companies that consistently pay and grow dividends.
- **Stability** - The fund seeks to invest in stable, well-established, and profitable companies at attractive values.
