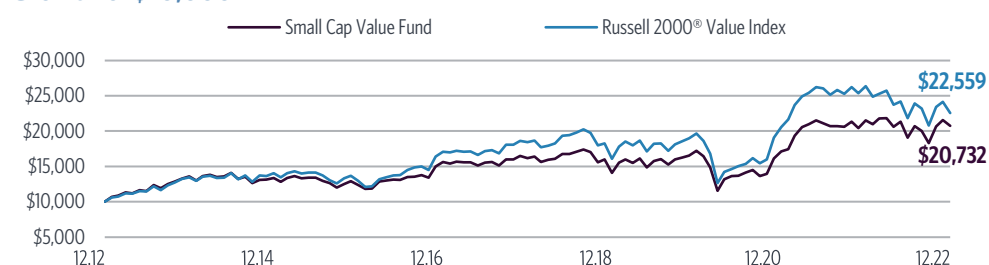

Fund Highlights and Applications

- Invests in a diversified portfolio of small-sized U.S. companies.
- Selects securities of small companies that appear undervalued by the overall market relative to assets, earnings, growth potential or cash flows.
- Applies a valuation-focused stock selection process that combines fundamental research with a proprietary quantitative screening process to identify companies we believe have the potential to outperform.

The Institutional Class was rated, based on its risk-adjusted returns, 4 stars for the Overall, 3-year, 5-year, and 3 stars for the 10-year periods among 453, 453, 426, and 322 Small Value funds, respectively. The Morningstar Rating for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products with at least a three-year history and does not include the effect of sales charges. Exchange-traded funds and open-end mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics.

Index and Other Definitions: The Russell 2000® Value Index measures the performance for the small-cap value segment of the U.S. equity universe. It includes those Russell 2000 Index companies with lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values. The trailing P/E ratio is the weighted average of each individual

stock's P/E ratio. The P/E ratio of a stock is calculated by dividing the current price of the stock by its trailing 12-month's earnings per share. The Price/Book ratio is the market price of a stock divided by the book value per share. Return on equity is net income divided by net worth. The three-year EPS growth rate is a weighted average of each stock holding's growth rate in earnings per share (EPS). EPS is total earnings divided by the number of shares outstanding. This measure is not a forecast of the fund's performance.

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
