



The Fund will not benefit from current favorable federal income tax rates on long-term capital gains, and Fund income and losses will not be passed on to shareholders. The Fund accrues deferred income taxes for future tax liabilities associated with the portion of MLP distributions considered to be a tax-deferred return of capital and for any net operating gains as well as capital appreciation of its investments. This deferred tax liability is reflected in the daily NAV and as a result, the Fund's after-tax performance could differ significantly from the underlying assets even if the pre-tax performance is closely tracked.

The Alerian US Midstream Energy Index is comprised of US energy infrastructure companies that earn the majority of their cash flow from midstream activities. The S&P 500[®] Index is an unmanaged index commonly used to measure the performance of U.S. stocks. One cannot invest directly in an index.
