

Price-to-book is a ratio used to compare a stocks market value to its book value. It is calculated by dividing the current closing price of the stock by the latest quarters book value per share. The Sharpe Ratio measures the risk-adjusted performance. The risk-free rate is subtracted from the rote of return for a portfolio and the result is divided by the standard deviation of the risk-free rate subtracted from the portfolio returns. P/E Ratio is a ratio of security price to earnings per share. Typically, an undervalued security is characterized by a high P/E ratio looks back at 12-month earnings per share share for the next fiscal year. Price-to-sales is a valuation ratio that compares a company's stock price to its revenues. The price-to-sales ratio is an indicator of the value placed on each dollar of a company's sales or revenues. Weighted Average Market Capitalization refers to a stock market index in which larger companies (i.e. with higher market capitalization) have more influence on the indexs performance. Volatility is measured by the standard deviation, or dispersion of a set of data from its mean, based on historical portfolio returns. A larger spread of data indicates higher standard deviation and higher volatility.
