#### **DEFINITIONS**

MSCI Emerging Markets Top 50 Dividend Index The MSCI Emerging Markets Top 50 Dividend Index is based on the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, its parent index, which includes large and mid-cap stocks across 23 Emerging Markets (EM) countries. The index aims to reflect the performance of 50 securities from the MSCI EM Index, selected by dividend yield that have increased or maintained their dividend per share compared to the previous year or have increased or maintained their payout ratio (defined as dividend per share/earnings per share) if the dividend per share has dropped by up to 10%.

12-Month Trailing Yield

The distribution yield an investor would have received if they had held the Fund over the last twelve months, assuming the most recent NAV. The 12-Month Trailing Yield is calculated by summing any income, capital gains and return of capital distributions over the past twelve months and dividing by the sum of the most recent NAV and any capital gain distributions made over the same period.

(1) The Fund's name, investment objective, and investment strategy changed effective November 16, 2016. The Fund inception date reflects the original inception date of the Fund when it was the Global X SuperDividend Emerging Markets ETF. (2) The Hybrid SuperDividend Index consists of the INDXX SuperDividend Emerging Markets Index from the inception of the Fund through November 15, 2016, and the MSCI Emerging Markets Top 50 Dividend Index going forward.
