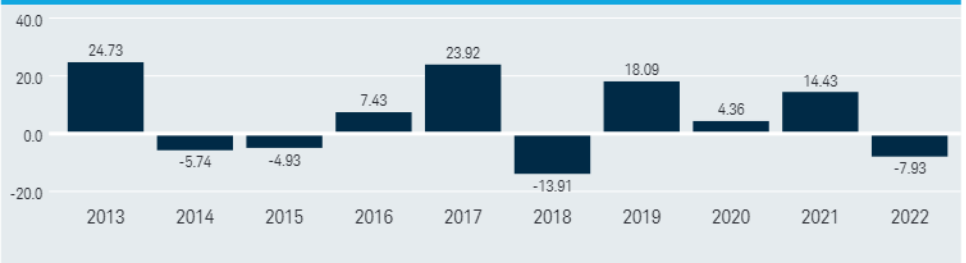

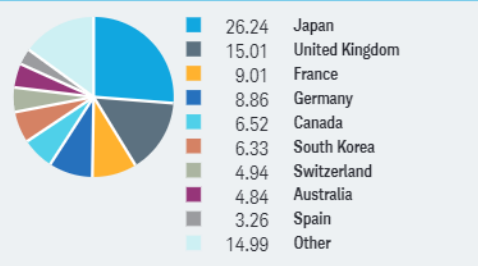

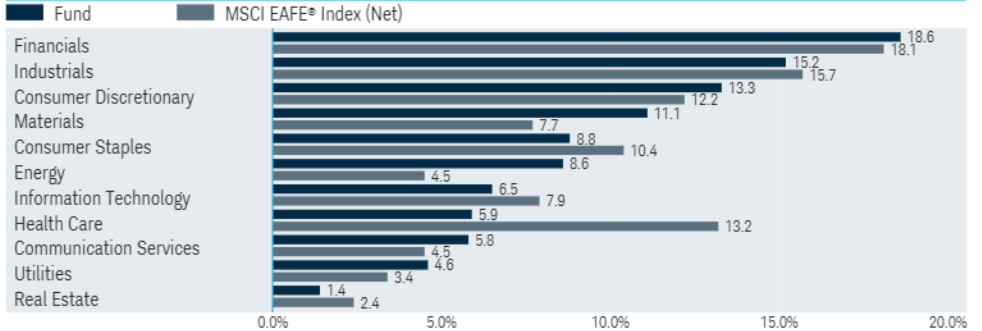
Top 10 countries⁶ (% of portfolio) as of 3/31/23

(Each share class is counted as a fraction of 1 fund within this scale and rated separately, which may cause slight variations in the distribution percentages). The top 10% of the funds in an investment category receive 5 stars, 22.5% receive 4 stars, 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star.

The FTSE RAFI Developed ex US 1000 Index is composed of the largest 1,000 listed companies incorporated outside the United States, ranked by four fundamental financial measures of size, sales, cash flows, book value and dividends. The index is rebalanced and reconstituted annually.

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
