Fund description

The Invesco S&P SmallCap Financials ETF (Fund) is based on the S&P SmallCap 600[®] Capped Financials Real Estate Index (Index). The Fund will normally invest at least 90% of its total assets in the securities, which may include real estate investment trusts ("REITs"), of small-capitalization US financial service companies that comprise the Index. The Index is designed to measure the overall performance of common stocks of US financial services companies. These companies are principally engaged in the business of providing services and products, including banking, investment services, insurance and real estate finance services.

The Index is a subset of the S&P SmallCap 600® Index, which is a float-adjusted, marketcapitalization-weighted index reflecting the US small-cap market. The Fund and the Index are rebalanced and reconstituted quarterly.



30 Day SEC Unsubsidized Yield reflects the 30-day yield if the investment adviser were not waiving all or part of its fee or reimbursing the fund for part of its expenses. Total return would have also been lower in the absence of these temporary reimbursements or waivers.

30 Day SEC Yield is based on a 30-day period and is computed by dividing the net investment income per

share earned during the period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the period.

Intraday NAV is a symbol representing estimated fair value based on the most recent intraday price of underlying assets.

- Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio (P/B Ratio) is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.
- Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is the share price divided by
- earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.
- Weighted Average Return on Equity is net income divided by net worth.
- Weighted Market Capitalization is the sum of each underlying securities market value.
