- Seeks to provide the investable universe of publicly traded companies domiciled in China that are available to foreign investors
- May also include China A Shares available via the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect or Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect Facilities

About This Benchmark

The S&P® China BMI Index is a market capitalization weighted index designed to define and measure the investable universe of publicly traded companies domiciled in China available to foreign investors. The Index also may include equity securities issued by companies incorporated in Mainland China that are denominated and currently traded in Renminbi on the Shanghai or Shenzhen Exchanges via the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect or Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect facilities (commonly known as "A Shares" or "China A Shares"). The Index component securities are a subset, based on region, of component securities included in the S&P Global BMI (Broad Market Index). The S&P Global BMI is a rules-based, float-adjusted market-cap weighted index that measures global stock market performance.

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Glossary

NAV The market value of a mutual fund's or ETFs total assets, minus liabilities, divided by the number of shares outstanding.

Market Value Determined by the midpoint between the bid/offer prices as of the closing time of the New York Stock Exchange (typically 4:00PM EST) on business days.

Gross Expense Ratio The fund's total annual operating expense ratio. It is gross of any fee waivers or expense reimbursements. It can be found in the fund's most recent prospectus.

30 Day SEC Yield (Also known as Standardized Yield) An annualized yield that is calculated by dividing the net investment income earned by the fund over the most recent 30-day period by the current maximum offering price.

Index Dividend Yield The weighted average of the underlyings' indicated annual dividend divided by price, expressed as a percentage.

Price/Earnings Ratio FY1 The weighted harmonic average of current share price divided by the forecasted one year earnings per share for each security in the fund. Negative and positive outliers are included in the calculation.

Price/Book Ratio The weighted harmonic average of closing market price divided by

the most recent reported book value for each security in the fund's portfolio as calculated for the last twelve months.
