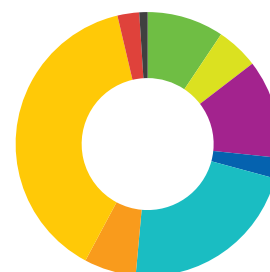

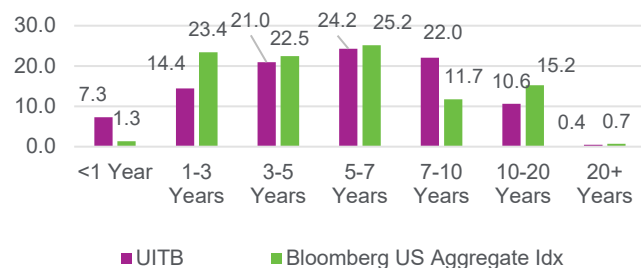

Average effective duration is a duration calculation for bonds that have embedded options. This measure of duration takes into account the fact that expected cash flows will fluctuate as interest rates change and is, therefore, a measure of risk. **Duration** is a weighted average of the

maturity of all income streams from a bond or portfolio of bonds. Generally, the higher the duration, the more sensitive the bond or bond portfolio to changes in interest rates. **Market capitalization** is the total dollar value of all outstanding shares computed as number of shares times current market price. **Market price** is the price of the last reported trade on a fund's primary exchange. **Net asset value or NAV** is a fund's total assets minus its total liabilities, divided by the number of outstanding shares. **Premium/discount %** indicates whether an ETF is currently trading at a higher or lower price than the current value of the securities in that portfolio. **Credit quality** ratings are obtained using Bloomberg methodology using ratings derived from Moody's Investors Service (Moody's), Standard & Poor's (S&P) and Fitch Ratings (Fitch). When ratings from all three agencies are available, the median rating is used. When ratings are available from two of the agencies, the lower rating is used. When one rating is available, that rating is used. Victory Capital Management does not evaluate these ratings but simply assigns the to the appropriate credit quality category as determined by the rating agency. **Subsidized yield** reflects fee waivers/reimbursements/limits in effect. **30 Day SEC yield** is a standard yield calculation developed by the SEC for bond funds. The yield is calculated by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the 30-day period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the period. The yield figure reflects the dividends and interest earned during the 30-day period, after the deduction of the fund's expenses. It is sometimes referred to as "SEC 30-Day Yield" or "Standardized Yield."

The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index (Bloomberg US Aggregate) measures the investment grade, USD-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market. The index includes Treasuries, government-related and corporate securities, MBS, ABS and CMBS.

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
