

Under the management agreement for Goldman Sachs ActiveBeta-Japan Equity ETF (the "Fund ), Goldman Sachs Asset Management, L.P. (the "Investment Adviser") will be responsible for substantially all the expenses of the Fund, excluding payments under the Fund's 12b-1 plan (if any), interest expenses, taxes, acquired fund fees and expenses, brokerage fees, costs of holding shareholder meetings, litigation, indemnification

Net Asset Value is the market value of one share of the Fund. This amount is derived by dividing the total value of all the securities in the fund's portfolio, less any liabilities, by the number of fund shares outstanding. Market Price is the price at which the Fund's shares are trading on the NYSE Arca. The Market Price of the Fund's shares will fluctuate and, at the time of sale, shares may be worth more or less than the original The Goldman Sachs ActiveBeta- Japan Equity Index ("the Index") is designed to deliver exposure to equity securities of large capitalization Japan issuers. The Index seeks to capture common sources of active equity returns, including value (i.e., how attractively a stock is priced relative to its "fundamentals", such as book value or free cash flow), momentum (i.e., whether a company's share price is trending up or down), quality (i.e., profitability) and low volatility (i.e., a relatively low degree of fluctuation in a company's share price over time). 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## To construct our ActiveBeta® Index

Start with the market capitalization weighted universe Score each stock in the universe on four distinct factors: Value, Momentum, Quality and Low Volatility Construct 4 factor indices by overweighting stocks with higher factor scores and underweighting or removing stocks with lower factor scores; constraining weights to remain broadly in line with the market Combine these 4 factor indices equally to form the ActiveBeta® Index

Rebalance the ActiveBeta<sup>a</sup> Index guarterly, using a patent-pending technique to reduce turnover

The Goldman Sachs ActiveBeta® Japan Equity ETF (the "Fund") seeks to provide investment results that closely correspond, before fees and expenses, to the performance of the Goldman Sachs ActiveBeta® Japan Equity Index (the "Index"), which delivers exposure to equity securities of Japanese issuers. The Fund's investments are subject to market risk, which means that the value of the securities in which it invests may go up or down in response to the prospects of individual companies, particular sectors or governments and/or general economic conditions.
