
Employs an actively managed, flexible approach that can potentially help capitalize on market opportunities through tactical tilts and asset allocation.

The Goldman Sachs Enhanced Dividend Global Equity Portfolio invests primarily in affiliated domestic and international equity and fixed income funds ("underlying funds"). The Portfolio will also invest directly in other securities, including exchange-traded funds, which may be denominated in currencies other than the U.S. dollar. The Portfolio is intended for investors who want current income. The Portfolio expects to invest primarily in underlying equity funds and equity securities with a blend of domestic large-cap, small-cap and international exposure, and expects to invest a relatively significant percentage of this equity allocation in the Goldman Sachs U.S. Equity Dividend and Premium and Goldman Sachs International Equity Dividend and Premium Funds, which have an emphasis on dividend paying stocks. In addition, the Portfolio will invest approximately 10% of its total assets in the Goldman Sachs Tactical Tilt Overlap.
