Objective: The fund's investment objective is to provide long-term growth of capital while providing current income.

Distinguishing characteristics: This strategy invests primarily in companies outside of the U.S., including the emerging markets. It focuses on well-established companies with strong earnings that often pay dividends, which can help reduce volatility.

Types of investments: Common stocks and equity-type securities as well as some fixed income securities.

Portfolio restrictions: Generally, the fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in securities of companies outside the U.S.

Implementation guidance: Consider for a core international allocation.

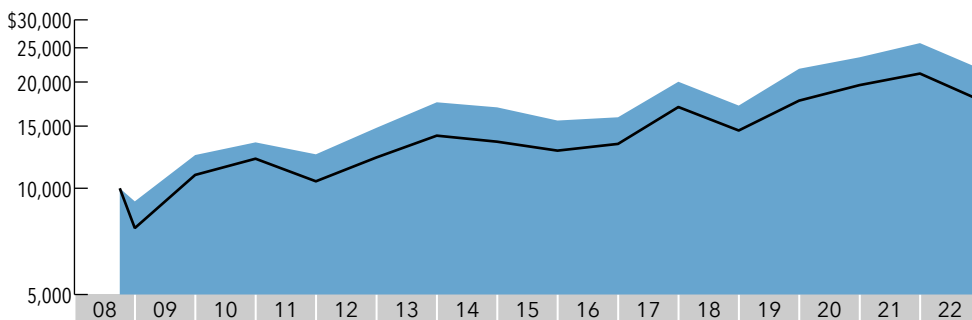

MSCI breaks out each company's reported revenues into country-by-country estimates. MSCI provides revenue data figures based on a proprietary, standardized model. Revenue exposure at the portfolio and index level was calculated by using FactSet, which takes these company revenue exposures and multiplies by the company's weighting in the portfolio and index. In this breakdown, Israel has been included in Europe.

International Growth and Income Fund Historical Benchmarks: International Growth and Income Fund Historical Benchmarks Index returns reflect the results of the MSCI World ex USA Index through 06/30/2011 and the MSCI All Country World ex USA Index, the fund's current primary benchmark, thereafter. MSCI World ex USA Index is a free float-adjusted market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure equity market results of developed markets, excluding the United States. MSCI All Country World ex USA Index is a free float-adjusted market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure equity market results in the global developed and emerging markets, excluding the United States. The index consists of more than 40 developed and emerging market country indexes. Results reflect dividends net of withholding taxes. These indexes are unmanaged, and their results include reinvested dividends and/or distributions but do not reflect the effect of sales charges, commissions, account fees, expenses or U.S. federal income taxes.

Lipper International Funds: Lipper International Funds Index is an equally weighted index of funds that invest assets in securities with primary trading markets outside the United States. The results of the underlying funds in the index include the reinvestment of dividends and capital gain distributions, as well as brokerage commissions paid by the funds for portfolio transactions and other fund expenses, but do not reflect the effect of sales charges, account fees or U.S. federal income taxes.

Results reflect dividends gross of withholding taxes through December 31, 2000, and dividends net of withholding taxes thereafter.
