# **Fund Information**

Began operations: January 1, 1934

**Objective:** The fund's investment objectives are to achieve long-term growth of capital and income.

Distinguishing characteristics: With an 80-plus-year track record, this strategy invests primarily in larger, well-established companies that represent a wide cross section of the U.S. economy. It seeks to provide long-term growth of capital and income with a focus on future income.

Types of investments: Principally common stocks; may also hold securities convertible

into common stocks, as well as bonds (generally investment grade – BBB-/Baa3 and above), U.S. government securities, nonconvertible preferred stocks, and cash and equivalents.

Non-U.S. holdings: May invest up to 15% of assets in securities of issuers domiciled outside the United States.

**Implementation guidance:** Consider for a large-cap core allocation

# **TERMS & DEFINITIONS** Lipper Large-Cap Core Funds: Lipper Large-Cap Core Funds Index is an equally weighted index of funds that invest at least 75% of their equity assets in companies with market capitalizations (on a three-year weighted basis) above Lipper's U.S. diversified equity large-cap floor. Large-cap core funds have more latitude in the companies in which they invest. These funds typically have an average price-to-earnings ratio, price-to-book ratio, and three-year sales-per-share growth value, compared to the S&P 500 Index. The results of the underlying funds in the index include the reinvestment of dividends and capital gain distributions, as well as brokerage commissions paid by the funds for portfolio transactions and other fund expenses, but do not reflect the effect of sales charges, account fees or U.S. federal income taxes.

**S&P 500 Index:** S&P 500 Index is a market capitalization-weighted index based on the results of approximately 500 widely held common stocks. This index is unmanaged, and its results include reinvested dividends and/or distributions but do not reflect the effect of sales charges, commissions,
